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## Sir Bob Scott speaks to businesses on the benefits of the 2012 Games

Sir Bob Scott, Chairman of South London Business, will encourage businesses across South London to start to prepare for the London 2012 Games today. Speaking at the Croydon Chamber of Commerce Executive Club lunch, to be held at the Selsdon Park Hotel, Sir Bob will share his experiences of how businesses and the community in Manchester benefited from the 2002 Commonwealth Games. Sir Bob has an intimate knowledge of the economic benefits associated with major sporting events, having led Manchester's successful efforts to bring the Commonwealth Games to the city in 2002, as well as being Chairman of the Manchester Olympic Bid committee in 1996 and 2000.

In his speech, Sir Bob will highlight the importance of understanding how the 2012 supply-chain will work, whilst making businesses aware that they will need to plan early if they are to capitalise on the investment in East London. "Businesses in Croydon, and indeed across South London, are ideally placed to take advantage of the construction, hosting and legacy of the London 2012 Games. However, to get the full economic benefit, businesses need to be aware of, and understand, how the Games will operate and how they can become part of the supply chain. It is not the case that companies can sit back and wait for the benefits to come to them - they must seek them out. Like the Games themselves, the tendering and procurement process will be extremely competitive".
